# Kisco Highlights

## 'Ilima's Top Ten Sustainable Features

- 1 A fleet of electric vehicles will be provided for staff and resident use.
- 2 New trees, shrubs and ground cover will be indigenous species and primarily drought tolerant varieties. The irrigation system will be designed to use reclaimed waste water.
- 3 All toilets and showerheads will be low flow and hot water will be continuously circulated in insulated pipes.
- 4 Appliances will be Energy Star rated.
- 5 All lighting will be compact fluorescent fixtures.
- 6 Swimming pools and domestic hot water will be heated with heat recovered from the central air conditioning plant.
- 7 Recycled building materials will be used to the greatest extent possible.
- 8 Recycling bins throughout the community will encourage reuse of plastic, glass, metals and newspaper.
- 9 Commercial kitchen organic waste will be composted to provide fertilizer for resident gardens.
- 10 The campus will use a highly efficient central chilled water plant that will provide air conditioning to all buildings from one source.
